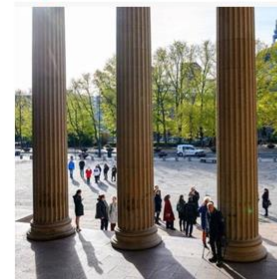

- Researcher Project for Scientific Renewal (thematic calls) – yearly, normally around March
- Researcher Project for Experienced Scientists (FRIPRO) – Open-ended
- Researcher Project for Early Career Scientists (thematic calls + FRIPRO)
- Large-scale Interdisciplinary Researcher Project (thematic calls + FRIPRO)
- Three-year Researcher Project with International Mobility (FRIPRO)

Innovation Projects

- Innovation Projects for Public Sector – yearly, normally around March
- Innovation Projects for Industrial Sector



Infrastructure/Research centres – normally every 2-3 years

South-East Norway Regional Health Authority (HSØ)

- Research projects – yearly, beginning of September
 - PhD fellowship
 - Postdoctoral fellowships
 - Open project support
 - Scholarships for research stays abroad (twice a year)
- Innovation projects
 - Research based innovation – open-ended until end of October
 - Service innovation
- The calls are open to all subject and research areas
 - A portion of the funds will be targeted at projects within thematic areas



National program for Clinical Treatment Research - KLINBEFORSK

- Funding for clinical multicentre studies



- Key features:
 - All four health regions must be involved
 - Bottom-up
 - Exploratory biomarkers for stratification and personalized treatments should be applied where relevant
 - New study designs such as decentralized clinical studies are encouraged
 - International projects are possible, but Norwegian involvement must be central at all levels
 - National infrastructure for clinical trials (NorCRIN) should be used
- Yearly deadline, medio May

- Funding for projects where the primary objective is to thoroughly explore and pinpoint the most promising commercial application prospects, including service innovation, in research findings

- Funding for projects for early-stage exploration of novel and innovative ideas with potential for breaking new grounds in cancer research

NordForsk



- 6 calls per year on average
- Most of the funding goes to health and welfare projects
- Collaboration between Nordic partners - requirement

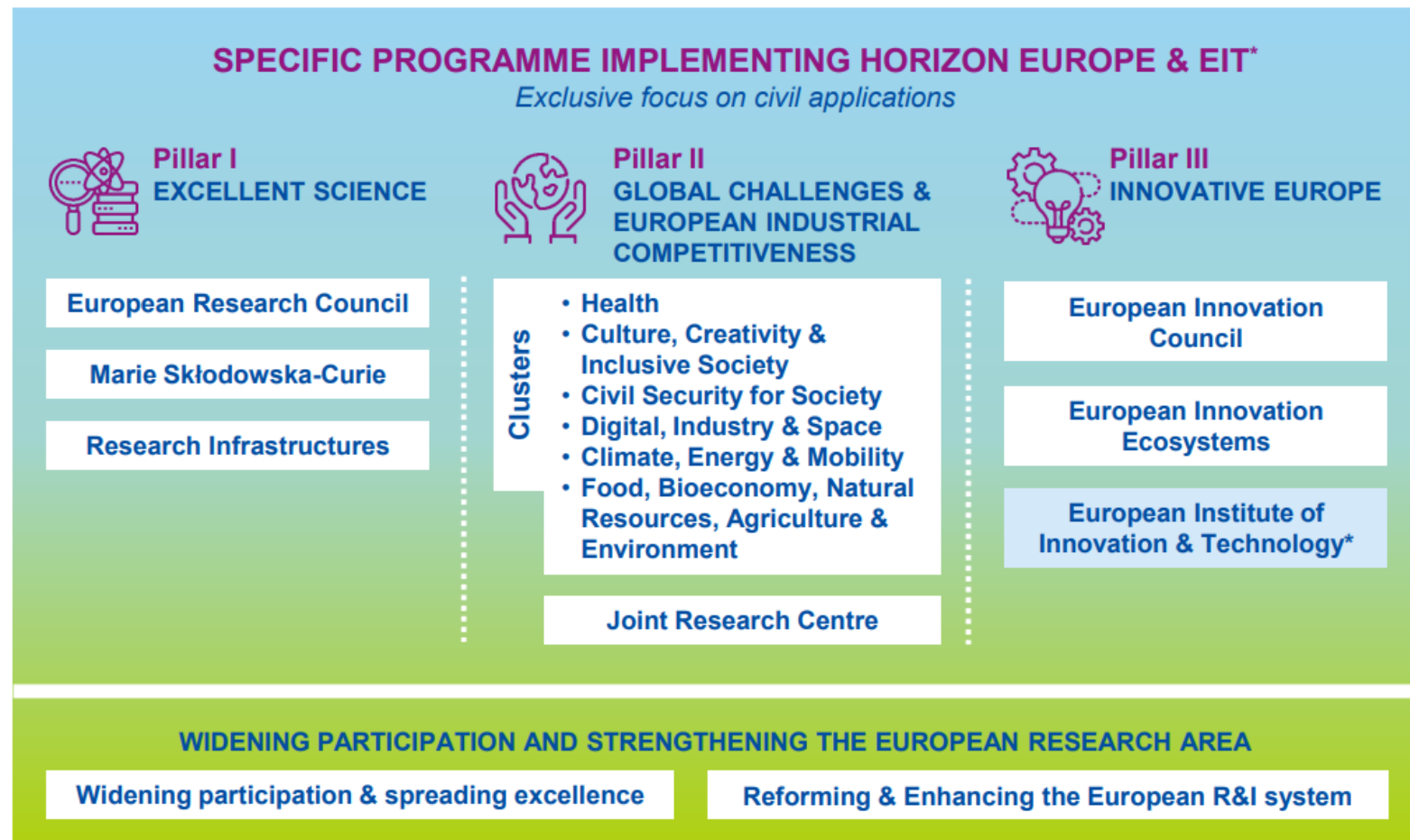
- Thematic and bottom-up calls related to

 - Distinguished Investigator Grant
 - Pioneer Innovator Grant

Horizon Europe



- EUs key funding programme for research and innovation
- Goals
 - fuel EU's scientific and technological excellence and the strengthen the European Research Area (ERA)
 - tackle policy priorities, including green and digital transitions and Sustainable Development Goals
 - boost Europe's innovation uptake, competitiveness and jobs
- Duration: 2021-2027
- Work programmes for the last period 2025-2027

Innovative Health Initiative

- Public-private partnership with the goals:
 - An EU-wide health research and innovation ecosystem
 - foster the development of safe, effective, people-centred and cost-effective innovations that respond to unmet public health needs
 - drive cross-sectoral health innovation for a globally competitive European health industry
- At least 45% of funding from industry or other project participants
- Funding scheme: Thematic calls, normally Research and Innovation Actions



EU4Health

- EUs 4th funding program dedicated to health with the goals
 - to improve and foster health in the Union
 - to tackle cross-border health threats
 - to improve medicinal products, medical devices and crisis-relevant products
 - to strengthen health systems, their resilience and resource efficiency

- The world's biggest health research funder: ~30 bn USD/year
- Support a vast selection of project types, research projects (small, large, exploratory) most relevant to Norwegian researchers
